# \* \* \* GRAND LODGE HIGHLIGHTS \* \* \* 191st Annual Communication - Nov 15 & 16, 1977

## AMENDMENTS TO GRAND LODGE CONSTITUTION:

- By two-thirds majority of votes present, following action was taken -
- ADOPTED Requirement that Article XXIII and Standing Orders and Resolutions, pertaining to subordinate Lodges, be read in open Lodge on election night is no longer applicable. However, WM and Wardens will collectively read these provisions within thirty days after their installation and certify this fact to the Grand Secretary in the returns of the Lodge. (Effective now.)
- ADOPTED Increace of the semi-annual dues for each member of a Lodge from \$1.50 to \$3.00 effective January 1, 1978.
- DEFERRED Changing day and time of Semi- annual and Annual Communications of Grand Lodge from third Tuesday to third Monday; and holding a second day's session at the Annual Communication, if necessary.
- NOT ADOPTED Permitting an amendment to be presented and acted upon at the same communication, if there is a two-thirds majority vote to waive the waiting period and requirement for written notice.
- Optional Open Installations Action postponed until the May 1978 Semi-Annual communication.
- Revision of Grand Lodge Constitution Will be presented for adoption at Semi-Annual Communication in May, 1978.
