It is disheartening that legislators and the general public are not fully aware that over \$1,300,000 is contributed every day by Masons on such public programs as Burn Centers, Muscular Dystrophy, Eye Foundations, Crippled Childrens' Hospitals, Cerebral Palsy, Dental Care for the Retarded, Arteriosclerosis, Speech and Language Disorders, to name a few. All this from after-tax dollars.

I wish for you all a happy and healthy Summer season. Take the opportunity to support the youth groups. Organize and enjoy outdoor activities. Participate in the Summer Lodges of Instruction. Above all, be a Mason!

or standing in the doorways.

From the solemnity of the dedication, to the fellowship which followed in touring the units and enjoying light refreshment, April 17 was a memorable day for Masons, their families and friends and the guests at the Homes.

During his address, Grand Master Haacke, shown below, made several points which put the event into a clear perspective —

- That unlike the homes, eligible purchasers would acquire an independent living unit, pay for maintenance, yet retain their assets.
- That the Masonic Homes exist because of our Masonic Family: All Masons and Masonic related organizations were involved in the purchase of land, construction of the original building, and furnishing of the Health Care Facility. The Chapel was provided by the Eastern Star; the original Clinic by the Tall Cedars; the Powers Lounge by the Scottish Rite; the new reception area by the Shrine. On a continuing basis the youth organizations visit and entertain the guests as do the various ladies organizations.
